



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History of The College



Reliving the transformative spirit in the Indian history that animated the 19th and the 20th century, Hooghly Mohsin College stands out as a beacon of enlightenment and a harbinger of cultural, social and intellectual movement known as the Bengal Renaissance. It is one of the oldest colleges of India which celebrates its rich heritage while embracing new ideas in the one hundred eighty-nine long years since its inception in 1836. Situated in the historical town of Chinsurah, the headquarters of Burdwan Division and Hooghly District, it is one of the premier academic institutions not only in West Bengal but in India. Following the blueprint prepared by Macaulay and with the help of a trust fund of the legendary philanthropist Haji Mohammed Mohsin, the college started its journey on the 1st day of August, 1836 in Perron's house, a magnificent piece of architecture overlooking the Hooghly River. For the first one hundred years of its existence, the college was known as New Hooghly College. On the occasion of its centenary celebrations, the college was renamed as Hooghly Mohsin College.

This distinguished institution is known not just for academic excellence but for its remarkable alumni who have left lasting impressions on society. Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay, the composer of 'Bande Mataram' and other eminent writers of Bengal like Dwijendralal Roy, Sanjib Chandra Chattopadhyay, Rangalal Bandyopadhyay were eminent students of this college. Biplabacharya Jyotis Chandra Ghosh, Mujaffar Ahmed, Kanailal Datta, Bhupati Majumder, Charu Chandra Roy, Pramathanath Mitra, Brahmabandhab

Upadhyay, Debendranath Mondal who were associated with this college as students or teachers, dedicated their lives to the cause of Indian Freedom Movement. A versatile genius, Judge and Jurist, wise leader, writer and historian, Syed Amir Ali was an eminent alumnus of this college of national heritage. Famous scientists such as Dr. Upendranath Brahmachari, Sahairam Basu and J.N. Bhar significantly contributed to Science and Medicine in the global perspective. Noted singers of India like Shyamal Mitra and Satinath Mukhopadhyay who contributed immensely in the cultural world, were students of this college. The pride that the college takes in its former students is evident in its culture, traditions, and unwavering emphasis on nurturing future leaders.

The Main building, the Science Blocks and the cheerful college garden lend quite a unique touch to the ambience of the college campus. Besides the Under Graduate and Post Graduate Departments, the college has a separate Law Section. The college provides its students an excellent setting where they can recognize and utilize their full potential to pursue higher education, become professionals and eventually play their own roles in the enrichment of the intellectual resources of the country to drive and shape their future.

The college was affiliated to University of Calcutta since 1857. The college was later affiliated to University of Burdwan since its inception in 1960. The college has been accredited by NAAC with a grade B++ in 2022.

About the Founder:



Haji Muhammad Mohsin was a prominent philanthropist in Bengal. Mohsin was born to Haji Faizullah and Zainab Khanam in Hooghly in 1732. He was self-taught and vastly learned in the Quran, Hadith and the Fiqh. He travelled to different countries - Iran, Iraq, Arabia and made pilgrimage to holy places, for he believed that travelling widens the horizon of one's perception. He led a very simple and pious life. In the Government record of 1769-70 he is mentioned as setting up several *langarkhanas* during the Famine of that period and donating to the Government famine fund. He dedicated all the income from his property for charity and, social and educational causes. It is believed that one- third of his fortune was donated for education and religious programmes, four- ninth was donated for giving pensions to the elderly and disabled and the rest was for the expenses of the two trustees. Because of his generosity he was called Danvir Mohsin.

He was the founder of Hooghly Immambara. He also gave 40 acres of land out of 42 acres for establishing Government BL College, Khulna, Bangladesh. To commemorate his immense contribution in the field of education, many educational institutions in India and Bangladesh have been named after Muhammad Mohsin. Hooghly Mohsin College, formerly known as New Hooghly College in Chinsurah, West Bengal, was established by him. The College was renamed as Hooghly Mohsin College on its centenary day celebration in 1936 to acknowledge the contribution of its founder Haji Muhammad Mohsin to spread education in West Bengal. On 29th November, 1812, he breathed his last.



Cells and Internal Committees:

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Hooghly Mohsin College was established in 2007, shortly after the College was awarded its first-cycle accreditation with 83% score in the same year by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), an autonomous body under the University Grants Commission (UGC). Since then the IQAC has been reconstituted periodically in accordance with the NAAC guidelines with a senior member of the teaching staff as its coordinator. As a post accreditation measure the IQAC monitors the overall development programme of the college and takes active role in academic and administrative affairs by finding out the areas of weakness and providing positive suggestions to the administration for overcoming the same. It also prepares the future project and plays the pivotal role in sustaining and improving the institutional quality. **In September 2022 the College has been awarded its Second-cycle accreditation with Grade B⁺ by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council.**

In conformity with the spirit that NAAC espouse, the IQAC functions not as just another layer in the administrative hierarchy. Though its ambit is all-embracing, the IQAC functions as an advisory and facilitating body rather than as a source of administrative instructions. As a catalyst, the College IQAC strives to synergize activities of the different wings of the College. Its responsibility is to nurture an environment that is congenial to an ideal teaching learning process, research activities, and a transparent and efficient administrative process which is sensitive to stakeholders' needs. Its responsibility also includes ensuring incentive compatibility for the stakeholders to discharge their respective functions to their full potential.

To this end IQAC gathers required information through regular interactions with stakeholders and periodic feedbacks through questionnaires from them. Important issues are deliberated on in its meetings. The College Principal being the chairperson of IQAC, the suggestions for improvement put forward by IQAC have an in-built communication route.

Internal Complaints Cell



The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 implemented by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India. The Ministry of Human Resource Development via notification dated 2nd May, 2016 made University Grants Commission (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of Sexual Harassment of Women employees and students in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulation, 2015. It is a comprehensive legislation to provide a safe, secure and enabling environment, free from sexual harassment to every woman. This statute was enacted to fill the legislative void which had been partially addressed by the judiciary in *Vishaka and Others v. State of Rajasthan and Others* (1997 (7) SCC 323). In this seminal public interest litigation verdict, the Supreme Court of India had framed a set of guidelines ("**Vishaka Guidelines**") for dealing with instances of sexual harassment at the workplace, which has now been codified in the POSH Act.

Under the POSH Act, an employer is legally required to comply with certain statutory requirements. One of these is the constitution of an Internal Complaints Committee ("**ICC**"), a body envisaged to receive complaints on sexual harassment at the workplace from an aggrieved woman, as well as to inquire into and make recommendations to the employer on the action required pursuant to its inquiry of such complaint made.

UGC Regulation states the responsibility of HEIs to act decisively against all gender based violence against employees and students of all sexes and to reinforce its commitment to creating its campus free from discrimination, harassment, retaliation and any form of sexual assault.

According to Supreme Court Guidelines Sexual Harassment can be defined as unwelcome sexually determined behavior whether directly or by implication as

1. Physical contact and advances
2. Demand or request for sexual favors.
3. Making sexually colored remarks
4. Showing pornography
5. Any other unwelcome physical, verbal or nonverbal conduct of sexual nature.

Objective and Role of ICC

1. To take consistent action for Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of Complaint received regarding sexual harassment, gender discrimination of women employee at Workplace.
2. Prevent gender discrimination and sexual harassment by promoting gender sensitization among the students and employees.
3. Make recommendations to the administration to lay down the procedures for the prohibition, resolution and prosecution of acts of discrimination and sexual harassment by the student and the employee.
4. Deal with the cases of discrimination and sexual harassment of a women employee in a time bound manner aiming at ensuring support services to the victim and termination of harassment.
5. Recommend appropriate punitive action against guilty party.
6. Constantly keep a vigil on the internal processes to check on the safety parameters for women workers especially.

What is Ragging?

As per the order of Supreme Court of India and subsequent Notification from University Grants Commission (UGC), ragging means the following:

1. Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or a junior student.
2. Indulging in a rowdy or undisciplined activity which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student.
3. Asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.
4. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of other student or a fresher.
5. Exploiting services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or group of students.
6. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students.
7. Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background

Punishment to those found guilty

Any student or group of students found guilty of ragging in the campus or even outside the campus shall be liable to one or more of the following punishments:

1. Cancellation of admission.
2. Suspension from attending classes.
3. Withholding/withdrawing scholarships/fellowships and other benefits.
4. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
5. Withholding result.
6. Debarring from representing in institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
7. Suspension/expulsion from hostel.
8. Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from one to four semesters.
9. Expulsion from the institution and campus debarring from admission to any other institution.
10. Fine ranging between Rs. 25,000 and Rs. 1,00,000.
11. Collective punishment: when the person committing the crime of ragging is not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

Hooghly Mohsin College has an Anti-Ragging Committee, actively working under the Visakha Guidelines and the Anti-Ragging Act of 2005 as per UGC Guidelines, to prevent any form of ragging within the college campus, be it physical, psychological or even sexual.

There is an Anti-Ragging Squad as well, keeping constant watch over the campus, in order to ensure the prevention of ragging. Our college maintains 'Zero Tolerance' to any of such incidents, if occur.

As part of UGC's initiative towards reduction of compliance burden of its stakeholders, UGC has revised the procedure for students to file online Anti Ragging Affidavit.

The revised procedure is as follows:

Step 1: A student will submit his/her details on the same web sites (www.antiragging.in and www.amanmovement.org) as before; read and confirm that he/she and his/her parents/Guardians have read and understood the regulations on curbing the menace of ragging. He/She will confirm & agree that he/she will not engage in ragging in any form. (Step 1 is the same like before).

Step 2: The student will receive a email with his/her registration number and a web link. The student will forward the link to the E mail of the Nodal officer in his/her college/university (Please note that the student will not receive pdf affidavits and he/she is not required to print & sign it as used to be the case earlier).

Step 3: The Nodal Officer in the university/college can click on the link of any forwarded e mails that he/she will receive from any student of his/her college to get the list of those students who have submitted Anti Ragging Affidavits/Undertakings in his/her college. The list will be updated every 24 hours.

Modus-Operandi

- An aggrieved student may submit an application seeking redressal of grievance through offline mode (any member of SGRC/drop into the complaint box) or through e mail ().
- The SGRC, as the case may be, shall fix a date for hearing the complaint which shall be communicated to the Institution and the aggrieved student.
- The aggrieved student may appear in person to present the case
- The quorum of the meeting including chairperson, but excluding the special invitee shall be three.
- The SGRC shall send its report with recommendations, if any, to the Principal and a copy thereof to the aggrieved student, within 15 working days from the date of receipt of the complaint.
- The complainant should be informed of the decision of the committee/ action taken
- If unsatisfied with the decision , the aggrieved student can re-apply to the head of the Institution with in one week
- Regulation for grievance may be revised time to time on the directive of UGC and as per academic regulation of the institution

Library

Hooghly Mohsin College Library, previously Hooghly College library, was established in the year 1836 with some donated books. That time there was no record of library in this district. Principal James Alexander Wise took initiative to start a library not only for its own students but for its neighbours also. College library was started with the grant from the Govt. and with donated books. Mr. Han was the first Librarian. In the year number of books as on record 9275 which now increases 1,14,800 books from govt. Grant, 3,500 books from UGC grant,10,000 books of rare types. There are some donated books also. Total collection includes approximately 1, 50,000 books. There are some books which may not be found anywhere in India, may be in the British Library, London.

This library has two parts, One in the main building and one in the Dwijendralal Roy Bhavan.

Our students and teachers are getting facilities with N-LIST services by which world class Journals are available.

Library Facilities:

***Lending:** The students can regularly collect books from this large repository of reading materials which has been a constant source of information and academic assistance over the years.

***Reading:** The students can also use the Reading Room facility in the library. They can consult different reference materials for a better understanding of different subjects and texts.

*** Free Access to E-resources:** The library has also access to different academic online repositories like N-LIST programme which contain a large number of research papers and thesis. Now initiative has been taken to switch over from N-LIST to ONOS (One Nation One Subscription) programme.

***Seminar Libraries:** The college Departments have also their own course-oriented seminar libraries with lending and reading facilities.

- In addition to the Central Library, each department maintains a seminar library, which caters to Honours students. Post Graduate students are also entitled to this facility from the respective departments


Laboratories

Health
